### Students Place in Model Home Contest



Membership in the Auburn Chapter of NTHS is based upon outstanding scholarship, character, leadership and service. To be eligible for membership, students must achieve and maintain an overall G.P.A. of 3.25 or higher and a G.P.A. for all Auburn classes of 3.5 or higher. In addition, students must attend at Auburn for a minimum of one semester prior to entry into the chapter and have two reference letters submitted with their application.
