m. Establish a Service Fund for Board Members: \$10,000

- n. Authorize Superintendent to employ personnel on an as needed basis, with such appointments to be presented to the Board of Education for approval at the next regular Board meeting.
- o. Authorize the Superintendent or designee to accept the resignation of any Auburn Career Center employee by indicating acceptance in writing on the employee's written or printed resignation statement; BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education determines that a resignation shall be final and irrevocable once the Superintendent or his designee has accepted it.
- p. Authorize the Superintendent or designee to approve student & employee out of state and overnight travel to be presented to the Board of Education for approval at the next regular Board meeting.
- q. Authorize the Superintendent and Treasurer to establish a budget for legal fees of \$100,000.00
- r. Authorize the Superintendent or designee to administer all federal programs and compliance with local, state and federal regulations. (Required by state and federal regulations)
- s. Authorize the Superintendent to serve as purchasing agent for the school district and spend a maximum of \$25,000 without prior approval of the Board. (Policy #6320)
- t. Authorize the Superintendent or designee to approve professional development for all employees of the school district.
- u. Authorize the Superintendent or designee to be the hearing officer for student expulsion disciple hearings.
- v. Authorize the Superintendent or designee to be the student suspension appeal officer.

- w. Authorize the law firm of McGown & Markling Co., L.P.A. to serve as the Board's designee for all student discipline, suspension, and expulsion appeals as authorized under applicable state and federal laws, as well as applicable board policies and administrative guidelines.
- x. Authorize the Superintendent and Treasurer to attend professional meetings.
- y. Authorize the Superintendent and Treasurer to approve student affiliation, clinical, preceptor and MOU agreements on an as needed basis.
- z. Authorize the Treasurer to open bank accounts as needed.
- aa. Authorize the Treasurer to pay all invoices within the limit of appropriations as invoices are received and after merchandise has been received in acceptable condition or services have been completed to satisfaction.
- bb. Authorize the Treasurer to renew liability insurance for the Auburn Vocational School District.
- cc. Authorize the Treasurer to advertise for bids as specified by law.
- dd. Authorize the Treasurer to invest active and interim funds.
- ee. Authorize the Treasurer to execute an employee dishonesty and faithful performance of duty policy in lieu of requiring officers, employees and appointees to obtain individual surety bonds for the faithful performance of the discharge of their public duties. (Board Policy #8740)
- ff. Authorize the Treasurer to increase appropriations as needed with Board approval at the next meeting.
- gg. Authorize the Treasurer to sign payroll and accounts payable checks for all funds in the calendar year 2024.
- hh. Authorize the Treasurer to obtain advances against the tax collections as prescribed by Ohio Revised Code 321.24 from the County Auditor in order to meet current expenses.
- ii. Set the rate at \$0.35 cents per page and \$2.00 per CD/DVD or flash drive for providing copies of materials to individuals upon request (Policy #8310)

- jj. Set the mileage reimbursement rate for 2024 at the IRS approval rate.
- kk. Authorize the Superintendent or designee to discard or sell textbooks, library books, films/filmstrips, and equipment due to age, condition, and/or beyond repair.
- ll. Designate Carrie McVicker, Assistant to the Treasurer as the District's credit card compliance officer in accordance with HB 312 and Board Policy #6423.
- mm. Designate the District's website whereby any person may access the time and place of all regularly scheduled meetings and the time, place, and purpose of all special meetings per Board Policy 0164.
- nn. Authorize the Treasurer to direct Board-approved legal counsel to file original complaints against the valuation of commercial properties, to file counter -complaints against the valuation of commercial and residential properties, and present evidence relating to the value of such properties.
